Spotlight: IS&T's Plan— the foundation on which to build “One IS&T”



In November 2009, IS&T began an effort to build a foundation and develop a plan that would provide strategic direction for our organization going forward. Today, we share with you the [IS&T Strategic and Operational Plan for FY11-13](#). This plan is the culmination of information from all of you, collaborations with our customers, input from key stakeholders, and approval by the IT Governance Committee. Much of what you will see in the plan should not be new to you, as the components have been shared and vetted throughout the year at department meetings, in email updates, in newsletter articles, and through conversations with your associate directors and managers.

Take some time to read through the plan, in particular *Appendix A: The FY11 Detailed Operational Plan by Area*. This appendix and *Appendix C: The Communications Plan* contain more detail on the operational project goals for the organization. These will be reviewed and updated periodically as our work evolves over the course of the year.

You are encouraged to talk with your managers and associate directors about the plan, ask questions, and provide feedback.

In an Emergency Contact: MIT-EMS

MIT-EMS is an entirely free, student-run ambulance service that responds to emergency calls from the MIT campus. Why as an IS&T employee do you need to know about this?

While many students are well aware of this service, many MIT staff don't know it exists. This is unfortunate and not in the best interest of patient health. While calling a Cambridge ambulance may seem like a big deal and something that should be avoided if possible, calling MIT-EMS is very different. MIT-EMS is free and its EMTs are accustomed to responding to calls that do not necessarily involve serious injury. They respond to calls of any nature – even if the patient is simply ill and unable to easily get to a medical facility on their own. They are also qualified to respond to far more serious calls (such as cardiac arrests or heart attacks). Unlike many city ambulance services, they encourage people to call for minor injuries as well more serious issues.

Calling MIT-EMS (they are reached by calling the MIT Police) is much faster than calling 911. If you call 911, they eventually get the call, but it's often slowly routed through the Massachusetts State Police and Cambridge Emergency Communications Center, then finally forwarded to the MIT Police and MIT-EMS.

Staffing Reminders:

IS&T HR Practices

In light of some recent inquiries by staff about promotions in IS&T, we want to reiterate our guidelines around hiring and promotions.

IS&T Hiring Practices

Even during this time of budget reductions, IS&T needs to hire to fill positions for core needs. Each vacated position is reviewed individually and decisions are made on whether to backfill the position based on critical needs, absorb the work into remaining positions, or eliminate it if appropriate.

IS&T Promotions

IS&T has been considering proposals on an individual basis and making a limited number of promotions throughout the year based on availability of an opening at the new level, staff member readiness for the new position, and the staff member's performance. We will continue on a limited basis.

All promotions, new hires, and external contractor/consultant hires are subject to review and approval by the Head of IS&T.
